## **RULES FOR EXHIBITORS**

- 1 All exhibits in Sections I to III must have been grown by the Exhibitor.
- 2 An Exhibitor may only enter one exhibit per class.
- 3 The Village Hall will be open for staging at 8.30 am, and exhibits must be staged before 10.30am on the day of the Show.
- 4 Entries must reach the Show Secretary by <u>5pm Thursday 21<sup>st</sup></u> <u>March 2024</u>. (except class 8)
- 5 Exhibitors must obtain an entry card from the Show Secretary in the Show room on the day of the Show.
- 6 So far as applicable, the Show will be governed by the Royal Horticultural Society's 'The Horticultural Show Handbook' a copy of which is in the possession of the Show Secretary. The floral art classes will be judged under the National Association of Flower Arrangement Societies (NAFAS) the show secretary has a copy of their competition rules.
- 7 <u>Please note</u>. Non biodegradable floral foam (oasis) will not be permitted in any class.
- 8 Prizes will be awarded at the discretion of the judges.
- 9 Prize money will be available from 3.30pm.
- 10 Presentation of cups and awards will take place at 3.45pm
- 11 Exhibits may be removed after 4pm.
- 12 All exhibits, personal property, etc. will be at the risk of the Exhibitor and the Committee will not be liable for loss or damage to same due to any cause whatsoever.
- 13 No persons, other than Exhibitors and authorised helpers will be admitted to the Show Room on the day of the Show prior to opening time.
- 14 TIES. In the event of two or more competitors tieing for any Cup, Medal or Award, each will hold it for an equal number of months during the ensuing year. The prize money will be divided equally among the Exhibitors.

**Please note**. Non biodegradable floral foam (oasis) will not be permitted in any classes. Competitors are asked to use biodegradable alternatives.

In the cookery classes, the judge will consider taste, appearance and uniformity of size.

Please cover all cookery with cling film or preferably an environmentally friendly alternative.

We want you to enjoy the Show to the full. Remember that your entries make the Show, giving great pleasure to visitors. So, go on, do have a go.

An arrangement or design is composed of natural plant material, which can be dried or pressed, with or without accessories, contained within a space as specified in the show schedule.

All plant material must be in water, or water-retaining material, or must remain turgid for the duration of the show.

Non biodegradable floral foam (oasis) will not be permitted in any classes. All arrangements (except class 51) will be staged on tables covered in pale green fabric.

The recipient must not have won this award in the last two years. The Sutton Vane Cup will be awarded to the Exhibitor with most points in Section I - Amateur Gardener Classes 1 - 8. The Parmiter Cup will be awarded to the runner up. A Daffodil Society Medal will be awarded to the Exhibitor with the most points in Section II - Specialist classes 9 - 24. A Daffodil Society Diploma will be awarded to the runner up. A Challenge Cup will be awarded for the best Narcissus (Daffodil) in the Show. The Clare Cottam Award will be awarded to the Exhibitor with most points in the Spring Flowers classes 28 - 33. The David Dampney Memorial Vase will be awarded to the Exhibitor with most points in the Flowering Shrubs classes 34 - 35. A Challenge Cup will be awarded for the best exhibit in Section V - The Floral Art classes 49 - 52. The Sarah Robbins Award will be awarded to the exhibitor with the most points

in Section VI - Cookery and Handicraft classes 53 - 64.

## SPECIALIST CLASSES FOR COLLECTIONS

- 22 THREE VARIETIES with pink, orange or red colouring in the Corona, any Division or Divisions. Three stems each, in three vases, one variety to a vase. (Total 9 stems.)
- 23 THREE VARIETIES. Three stems of each, representing three Divisions, one vase per Division. (Total 9 stems.)
- 24 NINE STEMS of any variety or varieties, in one container.



Division I. LONG TRUMPET One flower to a stem; Corona ("Trumpet") as long as, or longer that the perianth segments ("Petals")



Division V TRIANDRUS Two or more pendent flowers to a stem; perianth segments reflexed.



Division II. LARGE CUP One flower to a stem; corona ("cup") more that one-third but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments ("petals").



Division VI CYCLAMINEUS Usually one flower to a stem; Perianth segments reflexed; flower at an acute angle to the stem, with a very short neck.



Division III SMALL CUP One flower to a stem; corona ("cup") not more than one-third the length of the perianth segments ("petals").



Division VII JONQUILLA One to three fragrent flowers on a rounded stem; dark-green narrow leaves. Perianth segments spreading, not reflexed.



Division IV DOUBLE One or more flowers to a stem, with doubling of the perianth segments or the corona or both.



Division VIII TAZETTA Three to twenty fragrant flowers on a stout stem. Leaves broad. Perianth segments spreading, not reflexed
